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### What This Is About

Radical, unplanned, forced and, to some extent, undesirable changes brought about by the corona-virus pandemic, challenged each and every Higher Education operational model (the civil society model, the quasi-state market model, then free market model and the social democracy model). They also intensified the need for academic staff training in academic (university) pedagogy, especially with regards to the ways in which contemporary instruments and technological aids can come to the assistance of academic staff. Such a need, as well as the realization that the set of competences required for effective and efficient university-level teaching is, more often than not, not addressed in the course of graduate or doctoral-level studies have been felt worldwide for quite some time. Thus, Higher Education Institutions in the more advanced higher education areas have been compelled to establish academic instruction support offices within universities, as well as member-led, sector-owned organizations for the purpose of academic teacher training, the exchange and promotion of best teaching practices (e.g. Advance HE in UK).

To help ourselves and other colleagues, the Permanent Commission of Internal Quality Assurance of LOGOS University College, thanks to the HEI's partnership with the Democritus University of Thrace (DUTh), Greece, organizes, with the support of the Center of Teaching and Learning of this university, a cycle of short seminar sessions on university pedagogy. We are therefore inviting LOGOS University College academic staff members and other interested colleagues to participate. The seminar will focus on student-centered methods and techniques of teaching and learning in the educational process, as well as on the possibilities offered by modern Information and Communication Technology. The first cycle of seminar lessons will be organised in four meetings aimed at promoting university-level pedagogy and creating a community of learners, which would support academic teachers in exchanging best practices, recording their needs, revising, drafting, developing and implementing modern and effective academic activities utilizing the possibilities offered by ICT in academic-level teaching and learning. Each session will be two-hours long.
